

Conditions & Important Booking Information

1. Reservations & Payments

Generally, the price of day trips should be made in one payment, with the exception of those where a deposit is requested in the Leisure Guide.

For all overnight or longer tours, a deposit as stated in the Leisure Guide is payable to secure the booking. The balance must be paid in full by the declared date in the Leisure Guide.

Any customer who has booked a package with Bay Tours shall not assign, purport to assign, or attempt to re-sell the package (whether whole or in part), rights or interests under these Terms without prior consent from Bay Tours.

Any reservation made within six (6) weeks of the tour departure must be paid in full.

2. Medical

Please notify us of significant medical issues when you are considering making a booking so that we can inform you of any potential risks that may present themselves as part of the tour. Bay Tours reserves the right to decline/refuse a booking because of medical concerns.

3. Health & Fitness

At Bay Tours we pride ourselves on giving personal service to our customers. However, our guides are not qualified to provide individuals, who are not of reasonable, able-bodied health, the special time and attention they may need to make their tour a memorable experience. We're very happy for you to join us if you have a caregiver that can accompany you and provide help to you along the way.

4. Cancellation Insurance

In association with Cover-More Travel Insurance we now offer to members insurance against unforeseen events which may necessitate you cancelling your travel with Bay Tours. This is part of a comprehensive cover policy. It will secure your refund in the event of you having to withdraw from a booking. **We just need your date of birth in order to provide you with a quote.** There is a \$25 excess, payable for each claimable event.

- Should you decide to make use of this insurance, it must be purchased at the time you make your booking and paid in full with your tour deposit.
- Insurance Terms and Conditions apply and will be attached to your Cover-More Travel Insurance schedule which will be forwarded to you following purchase. Please ensure you take time to read through the policy wording and make yourself familiar with the cover it offers.
- Activation of your Policy by way of claim is between you as the policy holder and Cover-More NZ Ltd.

5. Behaviour

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd is not a common carrier and therefore reserves the right to refuse to carry or admit a person whose behaviour is considered detrimental to the enjoyment of the group. By travelling with Bay Tours & Charters Ltd the traveller agrees to accept the authority of Bay Tours staff leading the tour and accept their decisions. Our staff are entitled to a safe working environment and our passengers to a great holiday. Any threats to safety, either physical or verbal, or inappropriate behaviour by a passenger may result in their removal from the tour. If staff require a passenger to leave a tour, no

refunds will be given and the passenger will be responsible for their own travel costs from that point.

6. Cancellations and Refunds

With Cancellation Insurance

Should you be forced to cancel your travel with us due to a claimable unforeseen event, Bay Tours will calculate the level of direct refund we are able to make to you. You then simply complete a Cover-More claim form for the difference between the Bay Tours refund and the amount you paid for the tour. Once approved, Cover-More will reimburse you less the \$25 excess.

Without Cancellation Insurance

Cancellation fees without Cancellation Insurance with us are as follows;

Multi-Day Tours

65 Days or more prior to commencement of the tour:

20% of the deposit paid, plus any non-recoverable payments to suppliers of the tour.

64 to 22 Days prior to the commencement of the tour:

100% loss of deposit paid.

21 Days or less prior to the commencement of a tour:

100% loss of tour price paid.

If you cancel at any time, and following discussion with Kaye, you are able to get someone to take your place, you will receive a refund of the amount paid, less an admin fee of \$200 and any non-transferable payments to suppliers e.g., flights

Day Trips

5 Days or more prior to the Day Trip:

Refund in full

4 Days or less prior to the Day Trip:

No refund

We strongly encourage the purchase of Cancellation Insurance in order to provide peace of mind that the full amount paid is protected (as per Item 4 above).

7. Itinerary Variations

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd reserves the right to alter the tour package (including the itinerary) and substitute accommodation facilities and/or activities to those advertised should unforeseen circumstances beyond our control make changes necessary. The company will always endeavour, at their discretion, to select appropriate alternatives.

8. Tour Cancellations

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd reserves the right to cancel or withdraw any tour or any booking made for a traveller. In this event we will refund the total tour price, but will not have any further liability.

9. Liability

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd are not liable for and deny all responsibility for personal injury or property damage arising out of these activities.

The arrangement providers, namely the carriers providing land, sea or air travel, the operators providing transfers, accommodation, tours, meals and other services, all do so according to their conditions. We are so excited to be returning to **Lake Opouahi** and the **Kiwi Creche** managed by the Environment, Conservation & Outdoor Education Trust (ECOED). Nestled inland from Tutira is a very special haven for new-borns and infants. Kiwi eggs from deep in the Kaweka Ranges, and further afield, that might otherwise be vulnerable to predation are carefully transferred to this 100 acre pest-free area surrounded by a 3.3km predator-proof fence on the banks of Lake Opouahi. Here, they are free to roam, grow and learn to feed and look after themselves until such time as they are deemed ready to be transferred back into the wild. Bay Tours have made significant donations to ECOED over the years, sponsoring the tiny transmitters each bird is fitted with upon release. And we're delighted to invite you to join us in visiting the Creche for the first time since Covid put a stop to all visits. As well as the opportunity to get up



close to our national bird, we'll learn more from the Rangers and volunteers about the efforts to save the Kaweka Kiwi.

Following our visit to the Creche, we'll carry on further inland to one of our favourite Scenic Reserves - Boundary Stream - where we'll enjoy a picnic lunch and have the chance to experience the amazing array of native bird song as we wander the loop track.

Day 3: We enjoy a full day in **Endeavour Inlet** with plenty of time to relax around the resort. Explore the wonderful stands of native bush, grab a rod and go fishing or walk part of the famous **Queen Charlotte Track** while the rest of us go by boat across the Inlet, meeting up at the historic **Furneaux Lodge**, for lunch. The beautiful historic homestead, which is at the centre of activities at the Lodge, was originally the hub of an estate that stretched over 3,500 acres and is today surrounded by our chalets. An afternoon soak in the hot tubs will make you feel even more relaxed.

Day 4: After a slow 'Sounds time' start we depart on the water taxi heading towards **Torea Bay.** Here we'll be met by staff of our next destination, **The Portage**, based over the hill in **Kenepuru Sound**. This afternoon there's time to explore our new surroundings before dinner in their highly acclaimed restaurant.

Day 5: Again, let the tranquil tides of the Sounds help you relax here at The Portage today. Here are displayed a mighty collection of aircraft from both World Wars, including **Sir Peter Jackson's Great War Collection**. With displays created by Weta Workshop, our guided tour will be one to remember. We retreat to the **Scenic Marlborough Hotel** in Blenheim this evening.

Day 7: Today we journey homeward, first by Interislander ferry, then by coach, returning to our homes with many memories of a wonderful week together in 'the Sounds'.

In 2023 our annual multi-day cycle trail ride returns to where it all started for us six years ago - the famous Otago Rail Trail.

Since that first ride down in Otago, things have changed guite a bit. An important distinction about our tours now is you get to ride your own bike. As is customary on these tours, the actual time in the





saddle on riding days will vary between 2 and 4 hours of gentle cruising interspersed with stops along the way.

On this return to Otago there will be a number of differences to our last visit. We will be riding the Otago trail in the **East to West** direction (Middlemarch to Clyde) rather than starting at Clyde which is more common. This is to enable us to follow the Rail Trail with the new **Lake Dunstan Trail** linking Cromwell and Clyde along the lakes edge. So,

this year our cycle odyssey will be **9 Days** in total (not all in the saddle). It's going to be a wonderful experience and here's a summary;

Day 1 - Hawke's Bay to Dunedin: A leisurely start to the tour for us as we meet at Hawke's Bay Airport late morning and fly to **Dunedin**. By this stage our truck with the bikes safely aboard will have already been on the road heading south for two days.

Day 2: Ride Middlemarch to Hyde

Day 3: Ride Hyde to Ranfurly

Day 4 – No Riding Today: We give the legs a rest today and head up to **Naseby** to experience the curious art of Curling at the International Curling Centre there. After a bit of chilly fun we visit **Hayes Engineering Works & Homestead**. A historic site, preserved and run by Heritage NZ, which was a hub of activity and commerce during the gold mining and pioneer farming days. A great repository of local social history. From here it's on to **St Bathans** for lunch at the famously haunted Vulcan Hotel followed by time to wander this beautiful little settlement.

Day 5: Ride Ranfurly to Ida Valley

Day 6: Ride Ida Valley to Chatto Creek

Day 7: Chatto Creek to Clyde: Otago Rail Trail terminates here

& Cromwell to Smith's Way: First leg of Lake Dunstan Trail

Day 8: Ride Cromwell to Clyde: Lake Dunstan Trail terminates here.

Day 9: Queenstown to Hawke's Bay: Today we drive to **Queenstown** from our accommodation in Cromwell and fly home to Hawke's Bay.

There are few parts of New Zealand that are as enticing and attractive, and yet so rarely visited by Kiwis, as the north-west corner of the South Island. It is unique in that the crystal-clear waters and, literally, golden sand beaches would, anywhere else in the world, be cause for an avalanche of people for most of the year. But the somewhat isolated location west of

Nelson of the **Abel Tasman National Park** and **Golden Bay** beyond has meant that the region has remained relatively untouched by either big tourist numbers or a population

explosion so familiar to similar seaside spots elsewhere. Perhaps it is because of the relative quiet of the place, that the region has also become a 'Mecca' for artists and artisans. We're going to explore and experience the unique face of this magnificent region and get a taste of what it has to offer. Here's a brief itinerary featuring some of the highlights we have planned;

Day 1: Travel to, and overnight in, **Wellington** in readiness for our ferry journey tomorrow. There'll be time to catch up with friends in the capital.

Day 2: After our ferry crossing we drive via the **Rai Valley** to the famous **Mussel Pot** at Havelock (South) for lunch. Then it's on to **Nelson** with a stop at the beautiful **Pelorus River**.

Day 3: We continue west today to beautiful **Kaiteriteri Beach**, gateway to the magnificent **Abel Tasman National Park**. Here we depart by boat to cruise the sparkling coastline past *Split Apple Rock*, the seal colony and *Tonga Arches* to *Awaroa* and *Totaranui* before stopping at **Anchorage Beach** for a succulent seafood lunch and time to wander. After lunch we return to **Kaiteriteri Beach** and resume our westward journey over the hill and into **Golden Bay** to the little town of **Takaka** where we lay our weary heads for the night.

Day 4: This morning we head to Collingwood, Golden Bay's largest town, for an early lunch before we depart on our 4WD guided tour out to Farewell Spit. Along the way we'll stop at Cape Farewell, the most northerly point of the South Island, and Fossil Point, a popular 'hauling out' point for fur seals and where sea life abounds in the rock pools nearby. Thirty kms further along the sandy spit sits the Lighthouse and Keeper's Cottage where we'll have lunch as our guide regales us with stories of the area. There will likely still be some of the more than 20,000 godwits and 30,000 knot and other northern migratory birds that nest on the spit each summer. As we return from the lighthouse, we'll climb a giant sand dune at Mullet Channel to get spectacular panoramic views around the spit and out to the inter-tidal plain where the migrant wader birds feed. After our day in the sea air we'll enjoy a hearty dinner at the Collingwood Tavern before returning to Takaka for our second night there.

Day 5: This morning we head a little way inland to **Te Waikoropupu Springs**. Not only are these the largest cold-water springs in the Southern Hemisphere, but they contain

some of the clearest water ever measured, anywhere the world, with an average vertical visibility 63 metres! After of morning tea in **Takaka**, continue exploration of the natural wonders of the district with a visit to the spectacular Ngarua Caves beneath With Takaka Hill. its cavernous interiors and amazing stalagmites and stalactites, it's truly



wondrous experience. A late lunch in **Motueka**, back on the Tasman side of the hill, and it's back to our **Nelson** hotel and a little time to relax before dinner.

Day 6: A leisurely start to the morning before we head to **Mapua**, a peninsula jutting into Tasman Bay. Here a vibrant community of artisan craft producers sit side-by-side with food outlets showcasing the local seafood. We'll have time to wander and have lunch before retracing our steps somewhat to **Pic's Peanut Butter World** in Stoke. Based in a new purpose-built factory and visitor interactive space, hear the story of how New Zealand's most delicious peanut butter came to be. Tonight we dine at Nelson's hugely popular **Speights Alehouse**.

Day 7: Today we have a very easy travelling day home as we make our way to **Nelson Airport** and our flight back to Hawke's Bay arriving mid-afternoon.

Steeped in myth and legend from ancient Māori pounamu trails and Moa hunts to pioneering settlers and tough miner tales, 'the Coast' is a world apart, where every passing car waves to you and the hospitality is warm and 'old school'.

From Westport in the north to Haast in the south, we'll meander through this fascinating region where the natural environment still dominates people's lives in some way. Here's a summary of the itinerary;

Day 1: We fly to Wellington and then on to Nelson, where we overnight, and our Bay Tours coach awaits us.

Day 2: Today we meander towards the West Coast via **Murchison**. We'll have a midmorning cuppa at the **Buller Swing Bridge** before carrying on to **Reefton** for lunch and a billy tea with '**The Bearded Miners**'. Feel the pace of life slow as we head south-west. For the next two nights we'll be based in **Greymouth**.

Day 3: Today we take a very special journey. Firstly, we follow the coast north to **Westport** where the real journey begins. In four-wheel drive vehicles we leave the highway and follow river-beds into lush, native rainforest towards the remote and privately owned **Awakari Valley** at the foot of the **Paparoa Range**. Here is the domain of **Johnny Currie** – former farmer, logger, deerstalker and gold miner. Johnny lives life 'off-the-grid' as his forebears did in this area when they came looking for gold 150 years ago. Johnny's knowledge of bush lore is legendary. Over the day, as we move slowly through Johnny's valley he'll point out Moa bones, limestone caves, rare NZ plants and fish. Red Deer will be seen often. Johnny will share a billy tea and sausage sizzle lunch with us. On our way back out our guide will also take us to visit Warren Stratford and his astonishing private

John Deere farm machinery museum. What a day spent seemingly in another world.

Day 4: It's time to head south today and our first stop is a short boat cruise across the beautiful Lake Mahinapua south of Hokitika, followed by lunch at the famous West Coast Treetop Walkway, a steel causeway that allows you to walk amongst the



canopies of ancient temperate rainforest giants such as Rimu and Tamahi. And all 20 metres above the forest floor. Then we continue south through **Ross** and **Hari Hari** to **Franz Josef** where we'll take a short helicopter flight up to the **Franz Josef Glacier** and step onto this amazing force of nature. What a way to finish an enriching day experiencing the West Coast environment.



Day 5: After a night at **Franz Josef** we continue south picturesque Lake Matheson, photographed lake in New Zealand. And with unparalleled views, across the mirror-like surface of the lake itself, of Fox Glacier, Mt Tasman and Aoraki/Mt Cook, you can see why. After a cuppa we head south again and into the UNESCO World Heritage Area that is **Haast**. At this point we leave the main highway, stay with the coast road and arrive at

magnificent Jackson Bay, on the edge of Mt Aspiring National Park, for a glorious waterfront lunch at **The Cray Pot**. After lunch and a look around, we return to the highway and head through the **Haast Pass** towards Lakes Wanaka and Hawea. Tonight, we stay on the shores of Lake Dunstan.

Day 6: Today we first head up the eastern side of Lake Dunstan to Tarras at the foot of the Lindis Pass for a cuppa before crossing Hawea Flat to high country Glen Dene Station. Bound by Lake Hawea in the east and Lake Wanaka in the west, Glen Dene is 15,000 acres with extensive panoramas back towards the Southern Alps. Our hosts, Lesley and Jerry Burdon, will tell us about their property and give us lunch. We can also enjoy their extensive garden. Later we enjoy a scenic drive along the shores of Lake Wanaka to Glendhu Bay before stopping at the National Transport & Toy Museum. Another fabulous day of vistas and destinations.

Day 7: Today we say farewell to the South and take the easy way home by flying from Queenstown back home to Hawke's Bay.

On this tour we'll spend a week immersed in the very heart of some of the more isolated parts of the South Island getting to know the Westland, Haast and Hawea districts. An intoxicating mix of natural wonder and southern hospitality punctuated by some of the most breath-taking scenery New Zealand can offer. Following the popularity of our initial tour early in 2022 we're very pleased to introduce an updated encore adventure. Since the 1880s the hill country around the Gisborne District has been home to some of the most successful and innovative rural enterprises in the country. All manner of both agriculture and horticulture have thrived in this part of the East Coast at one time or another. Hawke's Bay farming dynasties have had numerous familial connections to the Gisborne area so we're delighted to pay a few of these places a return



visit AND introduce an industry giant we'll be visiting for the first time. Over 4 days we'll visit a variety of rural enterprises who are, like so many farms today, recognizing changing customer needs and diversifying their offerings. Here's a summary of the planned itinerary;

Day 1: After driving north and stopping for a riverside cuppa in Wairoa, our first farm visit takes us up the Tiniroto Road to **Mahaanui Station**, a 1,500 acre hill country sheep and beef farm that has been in the Bennett family for over 60 years. After a delicious lunch with our hosts, Sally and Simon, they'll show us around and we'll learn about the place from Simon. After our visit we carry on to **Gisborne** and the fabulous **Portside Hotel**, our home for the next 3 nights.



Day 2: This morning we visit Waipura Station which ranges over 2,100 acres on the steep hills just out of Gisborne. After morning tea and a chat in the woolshed with the Foster family, we'll head out in time to catch the shepherds in action with their dogs. A glorious lunch is in store at the beautiful Bushmere Arms before heading to our final destination of the day, Turihaua Angus Stud, the oldest Angus stud farm in Australasia. Established by J.N. Williams (of Frimley orchard

fame) in 1897, Tarihaua remains in the Williams family to this day. The family will show us around their operation and talk about the extensive history of Turihaua and the Williams name.

Day 3: Today begins in the Rere District west of Gisborne and another internationally acclaimed Angus stud, **Tangihau Station**. Since its establishment over 70 years ago, the station has had only 3 managers and is owned by East Coast farming legends the Bayly family. This is our first visit to the property and we'll have morning tea with the current Station Manager Dean McHardy who has run the property for more than 30 years, and learn why the sale prices of Tangihau Angus bulls are often the highest in Australasia. We'll also be shown around their recently completed complex for their on-farm bull auctions. No trip into this area would be complete without a visit to the splendid **Rere Falls** and, for the brave or foolish amongst us, **Rere Rockslide**. An amazing phenomenon

of nature. We have lunch at **Eastwoodhill Arboretum** and enjoy a tour of this national treasure by jeep in the afternoon.

Day 4: As we begin to make our way homeward, our final visit of the tour is to the epicentre of the Bayly farming empire, **Tahaenui Station**, near Nuhaka. Tahaenui is home to Sara and Humphry Bayly and to both **Cricklewood Angus** and the **Cricklewood Clydesdales**. We'll have lunch at the Station and enjoy a tour on a Clydesdale-drawn wagon. What a way to finish our trip into this remarkable farming district before we make our way back to the Bay. It's always a privilege to gain access to, and be shown around, private farming concerns and to listen to the people responsible for growing and maintaining them. Prepare to hear some remarkable stories of international success amid



all the familiar farming challenges. Places are limited so book early for this remarkable tour.

From the vast expanse of the Kaipara Harbour on the west coast to the glorious regional parks and beaches on the east, places like Matakana, Snells Beach, Puhoi and **Leigh** have become iconic destinations for generations of Kiwis. And yet the magic of the **Kaipara** district is known to few. We invite you to join us on this **7 Day** expedition as we explore this historic and vibrant region. Here's a taste of the itinerary.



Day 1: We make our way through to **Auckland** stopping

for a delicious morning tea at the Taupo Golf Club and at Tirau for lunch. We stay at The Parnell Hotel in Auckland tonight.

Day 2: Leaving Auckland, we head north into the heart of our destination region and to the famous Matakana Farmer's Market. This is the perfect way to begin our experience of this region with the opportunity to get a snapshot of the district and to try so many locally made artisan products. From here we head to another icon of Matakana, Morris & James Pottery where we'll enjoy lunch and a guided tour of the pottery itself. Since founding the pottery in 1977, Ant Morris has fiercely resisted the label 'artist', he still sees himself, and those who have followed, as artisans - makers of good pottery, not one-off studio works. With 3 sculpture gardens and 6 indoor galleries, Sculptureum will fill you with wonder and unlock your imagination. Tonight we'll stay at beautiful Snells Beach our base whilst in this region.

Day 3: We head south to firstly enjoy the splendour of Mahurangi Regional Park and then on to visit magnificent **Couldrey House** at **Wenderholm** before a drive through the beach resorts of Waiwera, Hatfields Beach and Orewa. Turning north again we lunch in the Bohemian settlement of **Puhoi** at their iconic pub. Then it's into the back blocks and to the **Puhoi Valley Cheese** factory – perhaps for their ice cream (and cheese). A scenic drive through the Ahuroa and Makarau districts returns us to Snells Beach with time for a rest and a swim before dinner at the Sandspit Yacht Club.

Day 4: A leisurely start to the morning sees us stay on the Mahurangi Peninsula today. First up is a visit to Brick Bay winery and their own sculpture trail and lunch in Snells Beach. We then travel down to the southern tip of the peninsula at Scotts Landing where we board the 'Shuckleferry' for a tour of the oyster beds at low tide and our own onboard 'shucking' lesson. There's plenty to sample and plenty to see.


Day 5: It's all about the wildlife today as we first drop into New Zealand's only reptile park. For more than 50 years the **Ti Point Reptile Park** has been caring for a huge range of reptiles. Prepare to get up close(ish) to everything from American alligators to pink toed tarantulas. This'll get the blood pumping! Then we're off to NZ's first marine reserve at Goat Island and the Marine Discovery Centre run by the University of Auckland. After a cuppa they'll show us around their facility and introduce us to some of the marine species in their huge research tanks. Then it's "All Aboard!" the **Glass Bottom Boat** for a guided cruise around **Goat Island** itself viewing a teeming ecosystem of reefs, fish and other marine life. Tonight we venture into **Warkworth** for dinner at the historic **Bridge House Lodge**.



Day 6: Today we are westbound as we first drive north to **Wellsford** before turning west to drive alongside the eastern shores of the giant **Kaipara Harbour** – one of the largest natural harbours, by area, in the world. At its southern tip we board the historic '**Kewpie Too**' for a cruise of NZ's largest inland waterway, into bays and inlets only reachable by boat. Our crew will point out historic Māori Pa sites, rare birdlife and amazing harbour views before we go ashore at

Shelly Beach for lunch before resuming our cruise back south across the harbour. This is a part of our country rarely reached by most Kiwis. This afternoon we re-board our coach and head south through **Helensville** and the historic winemaking towns of **Kumeu**, **Huapai** and **Waimaiku** before re-entering 'the big smoke' and a return to **The Parnell Hotel** in the heart of Auckland City.

Day 7: Our journey back to the Bay begins and we stop for morning tea hosted by owner Terry at **The Native Tree Café** at Mangatatara before heading onward to **Taupō** for lunch and then the last leg back home to Hawke's Bay. This tour offers the opportunity to explore, in more depth, a part of our country, on the fringes of the 'winterless North' that we've only scratched the surface of in the past. 150 years ago, people from all over the world came to the goldfields of Central Otago seeking their fortune. We'll spend **10 days** travelling these districts and experiencing these

places for what they are today. A route that will broadly take us from the mountain peaks that surround the resort town of **Queenstown** to the university city of **Dunedin** on the coast and so many places in between. Here's a summary of the plan;

Local experts will be on hand to help us get those stones moving. And if you think those stones are big, a wonderfully scenic drive to the coast will bring us to our next destination, the famous **Moeraki Boulders**. These massive spherical concretions are up to 60 million years old and, believe-it-or-not, began life as either pebbles or fossils. We'll have lunch here at Moeraki too. After lunch we gradually make our way to **Dunedin** via the coast road.



Day 7: Our first day in Dunedin begins with a visit to legendary Larnach Castle for a guided tour. We carry on further along the Otago Peninsula road out to the Royal Albatross Centre at the heads of Dunedin Harbour where we'll be shown around and have the chance to observe the new season's chicks sitting in their nests on their own while their parents gather fish for them. After lunch here we'll enjoy the scenic drive

back to the hotel with a few hours to relax or explore before dinner.

Day 8: We stick close to town today visiting a number of wonderful places. There's the grandeur of the historic house, **Olveston** and the magnificent **Dunedin Railway Station**. 



The section of State Highway 3 which follows the west coast of the North Island from **New Plymouth** up to **Hamilton** is rarely explored by those of us here in the east. Initially clinging to the coast and following the North Taranaki Bight before turning inland at Mokau to avoid Mt Messenger and heading into King Country. Following the Waipa River through Otorohanga to Te Awamutu and the prosperous rolling dairy country of the Waikato, it makes its way into Hamilton itself where it morphs into SH23 out to Raglan back on the west coast. So, we're going to spend a number of days wandering this area with plenty of reminders of classic New Zealand.



Day 1: We head west with lunch in **Whanganui** and a stop at the southern terminus of SH3 at **Hawera** then on to **New Plymouth** and the lovely **Devon Hotel**, our base for the next couple of nights.

Day 2: Begins with an opportunity to explore the city at leisure with destinations such as Puke Ariki Museum, the amazing Len Lye Gallery or the City Shopping Centre mall. Then, after lunch at the Rainforest Eatery, it's off to the magnificent Pukeiti Garden, in the shadow of Taranaki/Mt Egmont, for a guided tour. Taranaki must be amongst the best regions in the country for gardens and Pukeiti is one of their finest. We also visit Shedou Palms this afternoon.

Having led a number of tours across these districts, we've sought to include what we believe have been the best experiences of historic homesteads, gardens and activities we could capture in a **4 Day** tour. Following the turn of the 20th century the **Whanganui** and **Rangitikei** districts were well placed to benefit from the pre-World War I economic boom. More than 100 years on, many grand houses are still set in mature grounds and gardens and, in some cases, are still occupied by the original families, hidden away in the countryside.



Day 1: We set out heading south and, after morning tea, arrive in the settlement of Bulls. We're going to be hosted for lunch at the Bulls Friendship Club Hall. You'll be astonished at the history of this little town. After lunch we visit **Overton**, a homestead near Marton dating from the 1880s. We then head on to **Whanganui** and our base for the next few nights.

Day 2: We first make a visit to the unique **Durie** Hill Elevator which has, since 1919, been carrying passengers up through the hill to the suburb and war memorial above. Then we cross town to the Bason Botanic Gardens for morning tea before carrying on west to Bushy Park homestead, designed by Charles Natusch, and the gardens for lunch and a guided tour. From here we head back to town for a guided tour of the magnificent 120yo Royal Whanganui Opera House.

Day 3: Our morning begins with a visit to Paloma, a remarkable garden near Fordell out of Whanganui. After a guide to the garden, a wander and a cuppa we depart for Maungaraupi. This substantial house was another Natusch design and, after a tour of the house and garden we'll enjoy lunch with the owners. Our final visit of the day is, in our

view, one of the great country houses of this or any other district. **Merchiston** is one of the few grand Edwardian homes, anywhere in the country, that has been continuously occupied by the family that built it. In fact, the building is in the same fine condition it was when the last workman left in November 1908. We return to Whanganui to overnight tonight.

Day 4: We begin our journey home today, but we'll make our first special stop near Marton again. Westoe was built in 1874 for Sir William



Fox who went on to be Premier of New Zealand four times. Modelled on Osbourne House, Queen Victoria's private home on the Isle of Wight, Westoe spent 133 years in the Howard family before being recently sold to descendants of the family who farmed next door. After a guided tour we continue to re-trace out steps arriving for lunch at **Viv's Kitchen** in Sanson, a homage to the classic milk bars of the 1950s and 1960s. Our final stop on our way home is at the astonishing Italian Renaissance-style garden of **Villa Candotti** in the heart of Manawatu. Since moving to the property in 2003 Peter and Jeanette Cranstoun have designed, planted, styled and utterly transformed what was a 2 acre sheep paddock into a magnificent formal garden complete with a Florentine villa. From here we recommence our drive back to the Bay and home.

We feel lucky and privileged to be able to visit all of these remarkable properties. We know this tour will be popular so delay booking at your peril.

Day 1: We fly to beautiful **Queenstown** this morning where Ken will meet us with the coach and then it's the scenic drive to **Te Anau** where we settle into our hotel.



Day 2: Our exploration of Fiordland begins today with a trip into Doubtful Sound via Lake Manapouri and the Wilmot Pass. Three times longer than Milford Sound and ten times the surface area, a cruise of remote Doubtful Sound will reward with abundant wildlife and incredible vistas and birdsong.

Day 3: An amazing morning awaits as we cross **Lake Te Anau** and experience a guided tour of

the hugely popular **Te Anau Glowworm Caves** by path and small boat. On our return to Te Anau you have a Free Afternoon with perhaps a visit to the **Te Anau Bird Sanctuary** for those interested.

Day 4: Today we head to the iconic **Milford Sound** for an astounding scenic cruise around one of this country's greatest natural wonders. Then we're back to **Te Anau** for the night. **Day 5:** We depart Te Anau today and head south east to **Riverton** on the south coast and the famous **Clifden Suspension Bridge** (with a couple of surprise stop-offs on the way). Then it's on to Kens' hometown – **Invercargill** for the next couple of nights.

Day 6: In the morning we're off to **Bluff,** southern-most point of the New Zealand mainland. Then it's the beautiful **Maple Glen Gardens** for lunch and **Oreti Beach**, the scene of many heroics by Kiwi motorcycle speed legend Burt Munro.

Day 7: We're off to **Stewart Island** by plane and enjoy a guided tour of the island. Enjoy some leisure time in the afternoon for bush or beach walks. After dinner in **Oban** there will be an **OPTIONAL: Kiwi Spotting Night Tour** for the hale and hearty.

Day 8: Today we take the water-taxi to Ulva Island Bird Sanctuary for a gentle guided amble around this unique environment where they say the bird life is so friendly, they'll come too close for your camera lens.

Day 9: Following a return to the mainland we'll head to beautiful Queens Park in the centre of Invercargill. Perhaps a legendary Southland cheese roll at the Tea house, anyone? Then it's off to the incredible Bill Richardson Vintage Truck Museum for a nostalgic view of over 200 stunningly restored vehicles and some free time to explore Invercargill at leisure.

Day 10: We depart Invercargill this morning and, continuing our journey eastward, into The Catlins area of eastern Southland. We'll spend the day wending our way through this wonderland with lighthouses, waterfalls, pristine harbours and lounging sea lions. Then suddenly we're in **Dunedin!**

Day 11: We begin with a visit to the Royal **Albatross Centre** out at the very end of the Otago Peninsula. Then we enjoy lunch and a guided tour at **Larnach Castle**.

Day 12: We say farewell to southern hospitality an fly directly from Dunedin back to 'the Bay'.

There's a reason why many of the best annual garden festivals in New Zealand take place in dairying country. And that reason is WATER! The Waikato is one of our country's premier dairy farming regions and it stands to reason that there are going to be plenty of pretty spectacular gardens in the area as well. Over **5 Days** we're going to experience some of the best Waikato has to offer and, at times, you'll feel like you've walked into an issue of the English 'Country Life' magazine. And we'll make sure there's plenty of room on the bus to take home any new garden items, plants or cuttings you 'acquire' over the tour.

Day 1: After a leisurely start to the day, our first stopping for lunch at that monument to mosaic, L'Arte Café & Gallery in Acacia Bay, we head north to our first garden which overlooks Lake Karapiro just out of Cambridge. Chiddingfold is a beautifully maintained mature garden with original plantings dating back to 1873 with 'newer' plantings from the 1930s. John and Sally Coles came to the property in 1976 and have extended the garden further and brought a balance of



native plants to it. Sally will show us around and tell us about the garden's history. From Chiddingfold we carry on to Hamilton and the lovely **Novotel Tainui Hotel** for the next 4 nights.

Day 2: We begin today with a visit to **Lavender Backyard Garden** and their wonderful shop full of aromatherapy products and much more. From here we travel to the village of Walton, outside Matamata, and to **Villa Walton** which has been an integral part of the village since 1904. The magnificent mature Kowhai, Totara and Magnolia trees are full of birdlife and the ordered flower and shrub beds are a beauty to behold. We'll have lunch in the homestead before venturing out to wander this fine garden. In Te Aroha sits our next destination. Marvel at the brilliant sculptures made from recycled scrap materials at



Adrian Worsley Gallery. Then, after a quick reviving stop at the wonderful Kowhai Creamery for an ice cream, it's on to Hobbiton in the late afternoon for a guided tour of the 'real' imaginary world of The Shire and a banquet dinner in The Green Dragon Inn.

Day 3: This morning we head south into the King Country and to **Aramatai Garden** south of Te Kuiti. The 5-acre garden is owned by Leo and

Jill Mouat and is part of their farm. After a cuppa Jill will show us around the formal plantings of mainly exotics but also the fruit and nut orchards, sunken garden and vegetable garden. From here we turn north to Otorohanga and the private **Parkwood**

Garden, registered as 'A Garden of National Significance' by the NZ Gardens Trust. Just over ten years old, Parkwood is characterised by sweeping lawns and borders filled with colour. Several areas are devoted to moisture-loving plants while an enclosed formal garden features climbing roses, clematis, delphiniums and lillies. After lunch at the worryingly titled **Fat Kiwi Café** in Otorohanga we have a real treat in store and branch out to a visit to the **Otorohanga Kiwi House and Native Bird Park**. Set in beautiful

park-like surroundings, they have the country's largest public collection of Kiwi and other indigenous bird species such as Morepork, Falcon, Weka, Tui, Kereru, Kaka and Kea.

Day 4: This morning brings some **FREE TIME** to relax after our busy schedule of the last few days. There will be a shuttle to the magnificent **Hamilton Gardens** for any who are keen to wander the amazing themed gardens. After we



have lunch together, we're off first to **Woodlands Estate** at Gordonton. Here is a great example of a great house surrounded by a great garden. 3 acres of original plantings have been meticulously maintained since their inception in the 1870s and now feature a number of trees of national significance. This is a glorious heritage garden on a grand scale. From an historic estate to a very new estate. **Willowbrook Park** stands in 25 acres and was bare ground as recently as 2009. The owners moved from the south of England and wanted to create a garden in the 18th century English style. Over 7 years they spent their spare time building the garden and planting over 15,000 trees, shrubs and plants to create a series of themed gardens and outdoor rooms which blend with the surrounding countryside. Then there's the small matter of the nearly 10,000sq feet of Georgian-style Manor House they built as well. Owner, Peter, will show us around the house before we enjoy a High Tea and a wander of the garden. Phew!

Day 5: From Georgian grandeur to Edwardian elegance, our first garden at **Moondance Manor** could have sprung directly from the design book of renowned garden designer
Gertrude Jekyll. Designed to compliment the 'Arts & Crafts' style house, the garden



features extensive lawn walks with lavish herbaceous borders of colour, formal hedging and a large ornamental pond and island. How terribly, terribly English! Contrast that with our next and final garden of the tour, **Tree Church Garden** is exactly what the name suggests it is. It's a garden with a church made of living trees at its centre. Designed originally as a private garden converted from a tree nursery, in 2011 then owner, Barry Cox, began creating a chapel made from living

trees. Over 7 acres feature European and English inspired plantings, lawns, hedges and structures. But it's the incredible living chapel that will live longest in the memory. After morning tea here we start to head for home with a picnic lunch stop at Mangakino. Then on through Taupō and home.

What an incredible collection of magnificent gardens we have for the keen observer on this tour. It's bound to be popular so get a group of your garden lover friends and come join us.
